Scholarships In Agriculture

Application for the 2010-2011 Academic Year

Application deadline: March 1, 2010

The Farm Credit Services associations in North Dakota are offering scholarships for high school seniors entering college in the fall of 2010. Scholarship awards range from \$500 to \$1,000 each. Applicants must be from an actively farming or ranching family OR must be planning to pursue a career in farming or some other aspect of agriculture such as agricultural extension, agricultural education, soil conservation, farm and ranch management, agricultural finance, veterinary medicine or agri-business. Applicants must be residents of North Dakota, or the Minnesota counties of Kittson, Roseau, Marshall, Polk, Pennington, Red Lake, Lake of the Woods, Beltrami, Clearwater, Koochiching, Norman, Mahnomen, Clay, Becker, Hubbard, Wilkin, Otter Tail, Wadena, Traverse, Grant, Douglas, Todd, Big Stone, Stevens, or Pope.

Selection is based on academic aptitude, vocational promise, personal attributes, leadership and financial need. Children of FCS employees and board members are not eligible to apply.
